AURORA SPRINGS SCHOOL

OLD AURORA SPRINGS SCHOOL

Aurora Springs School District was established on April 4, 1882. It was formed out of the old Peter Thompson District, and a small part of the Franklin District. The assessed valuation of the district when established was \$26,939. Here, the Peter Thompson District, with an assessed valuation of \$17,605 belonged solely to Eldon.

The Aurora Springs District was formed into a Village School in 1885, then disorganized and reorganized as a Common School District known as District No. 9, in Congressional Township 41-15 in 1897.
