

HONOR ROLL OF HEROES





Allen Montgomery Norfleet, Private First Class, U.S. Army Son of Ralph and Pearl Norfleet, Henley, Missouri Died October 19, 1942 as a Prisoner of War of the Japanese on the Philippine Island of Luzon





Raymond Daniel Farris, Seaman First Class, U.S. Navy Son of Raymond and Beulah Farris, Eugene, Missouri Died November 7, 1942 from German torpedo attack on his ship, the USS Thomas Stone, in the Mediterranean Sea off the coast of Spain





Robert Bruce Spalding, Chief Pharmacist's Mate, U.S. Navy Son of Ford and Opal Spalding, Eugene, Missouri Died most likely May 3, 1945 when his submarine, the USS Lagarto, was sunk in the Gulf of Siam by a Japanese minelayer





Hobart Yancy Etter, Corporal, U.S. Army Air Corps Son of Paul and Rella Etter, Eugene, Missouri Died June 17, 1945 when his B-24 Liberator bomber crashed after takeoff from the Island of Samar, Republic of the Philippines





Gary William Berendzen, Captain, U.S. Air Force Son of Adolph and Lois Berendzen, Mary's Home, Missouri Died November 10, 1964 when his B-52 Stratofortress bomber crashed during a training flight near Wolf Point, Montana





Patrick Benjamin Kempker, Specialist Fourth Class, U.S. Army Son of Clarence and Sophia Kempker, Mary's Home, Missouri Died June 28, 1969 when struck by a detonated mine while serving as a Combat Engineer in or near the A Shau Valley, Republic of Vietnam





Darin Thomas Settle, Lance Corporal, U.S. Marine Corps Son of James and Arlene Settle, Henley, Missouri Died April 14, 2006 manning a machine gun while securing a motor convoy in the Al Anbar Province, Republic of Iraq
